2021 Decade of Centenaries Programme: Leitrim County Council Grant Scheme

'Local Legacies 1921/2021' – Part A: Community Strand

Background:

Leitrim County Council, in association with the Department of Tourism, Culture Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media wish to develop a programme of events to mark 2021 commemorative events around the county.

Community funding is now available for local groups registered with Leitrim County Council's Public Participation Network (PPN) and local cultural and sporting institutions throughout County Leitrim to play their part by developing an event/project to mark the centenary.

What is the purpose of Leitrim County Council's grant scheme ?

The key objective of the Fund is to provide support to local and community event organisers for activities/projects that will contribute to 2021 commemorations in County Leitrim. The Fund is being administered by Leitrim County Council and the aim is to support the development of community-led commemorative initiatives in 2021, in remembrance of this complex and challenging period in our history and will also allow for advance planning of commemorative initiatives for 2022.

Criteria

The following must be demonstrated:

- The extent to which the proposed initiative will reflect upon local connections to the significant historical events that occurred a century ago in County Leitrim.
- The extent to which the proposed initiative maximizes community and citizen engagement and mobilization around key events.

- The extent to which the proposed initiative demonstrates sensitivity and respectful remembrance and reconciliation.
- The extent to which the proposed initiative is unique, innovative, creative, interesting and likely to make an impact.
- The potential scope of the initiative within the local authority area and anticipated target audience
- The total cost of completing the proposed initiative.
- Any additional supports and funding that may be required and have been secured from relevant stakeholders/other organisations.
- The feasibility of project completion within the timeframe allocated.

What Funding amounts are available?

In 2021 the total available funding for community led projects is **€10,000**. The level of funding will be dependent on the number of applications received and it may be necessary to set a cap on funding amounts granted to individual projects.

Fund amounts will be assessed and allocated on the basis of requirements of the project and will be directly related to the above criteria. Leitrim County Council's 'Decade of Centenaries' Committee will assess and evaluate each application and make a decision regarding funding approval.

Conditions of Funding:

COVID-19 Public Health Protective Measures

All initiatives and activities funded from this allocation must adhere to all of the public health advice and guidance, laid down by the HSE and the Government, with regard to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Who is eligible to apply?

The fund is open to individuals/groups who intend organising community-based events/activities in 2021. To be eligible for funding, the event/activity must be based in County Leitrim and expenditure must be incurred and claimed by **Friday October 29th 2021**.

There is no guarantee of funding for events/projects which achieve the minimum eligibility criteria. The fund is limited and eligible applications will be evaluated on a competitive basis.

Please note:

All applicants/organisations must be tax compliant in order to qualify for grant payment.

All applicants/organisations must provide their bank account details as part of the application process.

Leitrim County Council will only consider one application per project.

Suggested Themes

Without being prescriptive, a number of broad themes are outlined below which may assist in the development of community-led commemorative initiatives in 2021. This is not an exhaustive list and other ideas and suggestions are welcome.

- Respectful, sensitive and non-partisan remembrance of all of those who died during the Struggle for Independence within the local authority area or municipal districts.
- Local connections with the significant events that occurred in 1921; How were events such as the signing of the Truce, the Anglo-Irish Treaty debates, and the signing of the Treaty, received or marked locally?
- An examination of specific personalities, (including local civic leaders), events and themes from this period that have a particular significance within counties or parishes.
- The partitioning of Ireland – its impact and legacy on communities living along the newly established border and farther afield.
- *'Ireland and the Wider World'* – local connections with the international dimension, including the role of the Diaspora in the events from 1921 – 1923.

- Emigration from the local authority area during this period – an exploration of memories, letters, archives, etc.
- The social and economic consequences of the Struggle for Independence and the Civil War within the local authority area.
- The experiences of women from the local authority area during the revolutionary period and their changing role in society.
- The impact of the revolutionary period on families and children.
- The aftermath of World War I and the experiences of those who were part of the war effort and returned to their communities in a changing Ireland.
- The role of local newspapers in a time of conflict and change – how were local events reported?
- The significance of local government reform and the evolution of new political and administrative structures during the revolutionary period at national and local level.
- Elections during this period – the prominent personalities and local issues associated with the 1920 local elections and also, the 1922 and 1923 general elections.
- The evolution of all-island institutions following partition.
- Initiatives to explore the 'Big House' perspective on the events that occurred during the Struggle for Independence and the Civil War.
- The Irish language during this period.
- Creative thinking and the arts, including poetry, literature, music and theatre (1919 – 1923).

- Significant developments in the world of innovation, industry and commerce, science, health, agriculture, and communications, (1919 – 1923).
- The importance of sport to communities during the revolutionary period.

It will be expected that all initiatives will connect in an appropriate, inclusive, respectful and non-partisan way with the Decade of Centenaries Programme and will be aligned to the principles and guidance published by the Expert Advisory Group on Centenary Commemorations.

Ineligible Activities

The following activities are not eligible for funding

- Provision or maintenance of memorials, plaques, busts, or statues;
- Hiring or purchase of replica weapons or uniforms;
- Production of commemorative medals or pins;
- Spend on alcoholic beverages, fines, penalty payments, legal cost, audit fees, financial consultancy fees and wages and salaries of consultants.

Both Leitrim County Council and The Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media must be publicly acknowledged in all communications and materials concerning activities supported from this allocation and should be tagged on any related social media activity.

How do I apply?

You should apply directly to Leitrim County Council. Only completed submissions received via the approved application form will be considered.

A signed version of the application must **be scanned and e-mailed** (with the appropriate signature(s) of the organiser) to pauline.brennan@leitrimcoco.ie You may also submit accompanying additional documentation with your completed application form as appropriate.

Applications for events/projects must be received by **4pm on Wednesday March 10th 2021**.

If I am successful how do I draw down the Fund?

In order to receive payment, the successful applicant must complete and submit a short **Post Event Evaluation Form** (which will be supplied by Leitrim County Council) and provide the following:

- Evidence of expenditure for the event/project applied for in this application.
- Receipts for the full costs
- Note: Payment will be made to community groups and not to individual(s)

Funding not claimed by the agreed deadline will be cancelled.

How will I know if my group has been successful?

Successful applicants will receive a Letter of Offer from Leitrim County Council. This letter will form the contract between Leitrim County Council and the event organiser and will detail all conditions and requirements.

Acknowledgement

Once you have been notified that your application has been successful in receiving funding, you must ensure that your event is promoted as part of this initiative and appropriate guidelines and requirements to support this will be included with the letter of offer.
